This newsletter is coming to you a bit early. I'm pleased to announce that all our passport applications went through, our suitcases are ready, and we are on our way to travelling around the world to learn about holiday traditions and customs. Friday was our first stop and it was in China. There we learned all about Chinese Ne Year. Please ask your child to tell you all about it. On Monday and Tuesday, we will visit Israel to learn about Hanakkah, on Wednesday, we will visit Holland to learn about their Christmas traditions and customs, On Thursday, we will learn about La Befana and holiday facts in Italy and then on Friday we will end the week learning about Christmas in Germany. In <u>Math</u>, we will continue to work on word problems that requires your child to draw comparisons between the numbers to find how many fewer or how many more.
