Dear Fabulous First Grade Families,

Thank you so much for getting in the field trip information last week. I really appreciate your support. I also appreciate all the people who indicated they'd like to chaperone on our zoo trip. I will send home more information as the trip approaches.

Please be aware that I am at an all-day training this Friday. If your child will be going home a different way, please send a note and let the office know.

In <u>Math</u>, we will continue to practice counting to 150. I will pull each child individually this week and next week to see how high they can count. Remember, the expectation is that all first graders will be able to count to 150. We will also continue to solve word problems with higher numbers. Children will continue practicing making a new ten when adding. Our second unit test on place value will be this Thursday. In <u>Letterland</u>, we will review words with **short e** and words that make the long e sound with **ea**. In <u>Reading</u>, we will continue to concentrate on and review text features (heading, table of contents, bold print, captions, labels, titles, etc.) In <u>Writing</u>, we will continue working on the final copy of their "All About" book. In <u>Social Studies</u>, we will create a poster for a good each child is interested in selling and we will write about a job we'd like to do in the future.
